

#### Highlight 1: Reviewing the Farm Income Forecasts


- Prices now off from January prices for almost all major commodities
  - Short vs. long term impacts
- Government support will represent the highest share of income since 2000
  - Market risk exposure
- Expenses likely to decline
  - Variation by commodity

#### Highlight 2: Pandemics and Demand


- Pandemic vs. Recession
- Foreign demand: strong exports for now, but future impacts from global downturn?
- Domestic demand: pandemic and recession have overlapping impacts, but low prices can incentivize consumption



Value of Exports and the U.S. Trade Dollar Index


### Highlight 3: Corn and Soybeans

- Can wheat hold on to early 2020 promise?




Weekly Cash Grain Exports

#### Highlight 4: Weather




- Midwest and Southeast expected to remain wet

Share of Labor in High Risk, Retail and Construction or Manufacturing

- Economic downturn is having disparate impacts across production regions
  - Great plains and most rural counties showing highest resilience
- Regions with high exposure to service industries and manufacturing have seen largest impacts


